Speakers:

Simon Heller is an attorney with the Center for Reproductive Rights. He successfully argued that Nebraska's so-called "partial-birth abortion" ban was unconstitutional before the U.S. Supreme Court in April 2000 (*Stenberg v. Carhart*). Currently he is lead counsel in *Tummino v. von Eschenbach*, a lawsuit charging the FDA with sex discrimination.

Carol Giardina is a pioneer of the 1960s women's liberation movement. Today she is lead organizer for Redstockings Allies and Veterans in New York City where she continues to work for feminist revolution in the uncompromising, "go for what we really want" spirit of the Sixties. She teaches American History at Queens College.

James Trussell served on the FDA Advisory Committee that voted for the Morning-After Pill to be approved for over-the-counter status. He is Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University and maintains an emergency contraception website (not-2-late.com).

Annie Tummino is Chair of the Women's Liberation Birth Control Project and Lead Plaintiff in the lawsuit *Tummino v. von Eschenbach*.
