
Re: *June Medical Services LLC, et al. v. Gee* - 3:14-cv-525-JWD-RLB

Dear Judge deGravelles:

Plaintiffs write to inform you of a development regarding Causeway Medical Clinic, ("Causeway"), a plaintiff in the above-referenced litigation.

Dr. Doe 4 refrained from performing any abortions at Causeway subsequent to the Court's January 26, 2016 preliminary injunction order and during the period in which the parties were negotiating a joint stipulation to ensure that the preliminary injunction encompassed him. The joint stipulation was filed on February 1st and so-ordered by the Court on February 5th. Causeway did not see any patients on the days that Dr. Doe 4 had been scheduled to perform procedures during this period, and consequently, was unable to keep its doors open. It last offered abortions, performed by Dr. Doe 2, on January 30th, and has subsequently not been open to patients. On February 12th, Causeway published a closure notice in the *Times-Picayune*. Counsel first became aware of this notice yesterday. As of today, Causeway retains its license, which expires on March 31.
